

John Arthur Heyes, Killed in Action 6th January 1915

We much regret to announce the death, in action, of John Arthur Manley Heyes. He was a Corporal in the 2nd Battalion of the Royal Sussex regiment and had been at the front from almost the commencement of the war. He died at La Bassee, Northern France. He was married with children and our deepest sympathy goes to his parents George and Mary Heyes who live at Starchbottom, Harrietsham. They had just recently moved from Primrose Cottage, Fairbourne Lane to their new abode.

We have received a copy of the letter sent to his wife from his commanding officer, V Newberry. It reads as follows:-

“It is with very deep regret that I have to write and tell you that your husband, Corporal J. Heyes, was killed this

morning, but you will be proud to know that he was a very brave soldier, and that his comrades were greatly attached to him. I have been in company with him from the time we came out, and found him one of the best. You will be comforted to know that it was sudden and there was no suffering. Jack and I was talking last night, and he was saying how glad he would be to be home with you and the children. I hope it will comfort you to know that we are all proud of him, and please accept the sympathy of his comrades and myself.”
