## Harrietsham Victory at Kent Fencibles Shoot

No. 11 Platoon, Harrietsham, Mid Kent Battalion entertained No. 9 Platoon, Maidstone to tea and a shooting match on Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> January. The rendezvous was at Lenham, at the Dog and Bear Hotel, an inviting repast was provided by Mr. J. T. Hatch for the members of both teams. The Chaplain to the Harrietsham contingent, the Rev. H. de V. Watson, presided in the absence through indisposition of Mr Hatch.

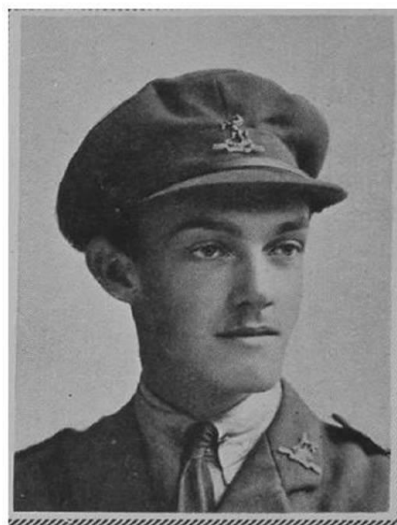
Following tea the company fell in and marched off to Mr. Hatch's private range, the Lenham Drill Hall, where everything was ready for the shoot. The teams of eight aside and parties of three fired from each side alternately. There was two competitions, firstly "Deliberate Firing", with marks out of 100 and then "Rapid Firing" which is firing 10 shots in 10 seconds.
