Major-General Ferrier addresses a packed Public Meeting

The General read a most instructive paper on the war and the need for more men to join immediately, and the duty of parents, sisters, wives and sweethearts to spare the young men for active service in the war. At present 28 Officers and men connected with Harrietsham were in the two services, and that more were prepared to go in a day or two. He reminded the audience that the danger was great so the young men must join the regular Army, Lord Kitchener's Army or the Territorial force, without loss of time.

He concluded with a warning not to repeat every rumour one might hear, as it might be helping the enemy by so doing. Mr. Philip Cutbush proposed a vote of thanks to the General, which was heartily accorded and after a vote of thanks to the Chair and the singing of a verse of the National Anthem the meeting was terminated.
